Reflections for This Week

How happy are the poor in spirit

Last week we heard Saint Matthew describing the beginnings of Jesus' public ministry. This week Saint Matthew begins the most important summary of the proclamation of the kingdom of God - what we refer to as the 'Sermon on the Mount.' This great collection of Jesus' teachings begins with the Beatitudes - the Charter of the Kingdom. It is essential to understand these, if we are to understand what we will read in Saint Matthew during the rest of this year: the key, as underlined by the First Reading, is that the values of this world are not the values of the Kingdom of God - the Kingdom will see things turned upside down: happiness and blessing belong to those whom this world would ignore or mistreat. If we truly wish to live out the Gospel, we would do well to reflect on the virtues laid out in this familiar passage.

Marriage Matters: Being human - we are human be-ings, not do-ings: With the ever-increasing pace of life, when do we get a chance 'to be'? Today, the Word of God is intended to relate more to the deeper aspects of our humanity and the inner essence of our being, and the qualities of our personhood. It's about the ways we relate to each other in our marriages, our families, our communities.

Think Vocation: "Happy are the pure in heart – they shall see God." The Lord can work with people who are genuine and full of integrity. Young people can see through what is false and superficial: as Catholics, we need to be genuine and sincere in everything we do and this will draw young people to want to serve as priests and religious in the Church.

Votive Candles: Three weeks ago, we mentioned that we would be taking advantage of a free trial offer for a new system of votive candles at both our churches. This trial period will begin with the arrival of the new votive candle stands this week.

Called St Killian's, it claims to be the cleanest, safest, and most environmentally friendly votive candle burning system in the world. The candle holders are made from recycled glass and, as the candles fit directly into them, there is no plastic or aluminium waste. As the candles burn, the final bit of wax drops through into a water bath (increasing safety) and this waste wax is collected for recycling.

The manufacturers of this system recommend a price of 50p per candle but (as always) you will be free to give whatever donation you can afford. Any money collected during the trial period will be retained by the parish (so it is a free trial). If we decide to keep the system, then there is a one-off payment for each candle stand and then we would need to buy the candles directly from them (though they will give us quite a lot of free candles at the start).
