## **Reflections for This Week**

Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world.

There is no break between Christmas and Ordinary Time – one flows almost seamlessly into the other through the Baptism of Jesus. We ended our Christmas Season thinking about the "revelation" of the Son of God – people realising who this "Jesus of Nazareth" actually was – and this continues today, as we interject a passage from Saint John before we begin our weekly reading through Saint Matthew's Gospel. New Year is about beginnings, and as we return to the beginning of Our Lord's public ministry there is a sense of something exciting about to happen – even though we know the story, we dive into it once more, like returning to a favourite novel or film. So it is with joy that we stand in the country of the river Jordan, and recognise Jesus of Nazareth as the Chosen One of God, who offers himself to do God's work.

**Marriage Matters:** *We need 'power from on high':* Were Jesus' fears eased when he heard the Father was 'well pleased'? He was empowered by the Holy Spirit to begin his mission: to bring to the world the Good News of God's compassion, mercy and forgiveness for our sins. By daily dialogue about concerns and issues and by seeking 'help from on high', we can overcome our fears.

Think Vocation: "Here I am Lord! I come to do your will." We could do no better than put this response to today's psalm on our lips, as the first words we speak each and every day. If we want to live fruitful and fulfilling lives we will want to seek to do God's will and not just satisfy our own wishes. Through the quality of our prayer life we will develop a personal relationship with Christ which will enable us to know deep down the direction Our Lord wants our lives to take.

### **Contactless Giving**

**Mikron Theatre**: The next production (raising money for Loaves and Fishes) will be on Wednesday 19 April. This will take place in the Parish Centre at St Luke's (not at Ss Peter & Paul as was stated last week). More details to follow.

**500 Club:** A reminder to current members who pay by cash or cheque, whether annually or monthly, that January is the start of the new year for your subscriptions. Please put these in an envelope with your name and a note of the 500 Club number(s) the payment(s) relate to and hand this in at church or through the letter box at St Luke's. This is also the ideal time for any new members to join the 500 Club. To do so, please put your name, address and telephone number in an envelope and also indicate how you wish to pay: Annual Direct Debit, Cash or Cheque (£60) or Monthly Direct Debit, Cash or Cheque (£5). Mark the envelope "New 500 Club Member" and either put it in the collection basket at church or post it through the letter box at St Luke's. You will then be contacted and a number issued to you.

Retreat for Year 7s: As part of our work with young people in the deanery, we are again offering a retreat for pupils in Year 7. This retreat will be run by NET ministries Scotland. NET is a peer to peer youth ministry that puts into action the Church's mission to evangelise young people. The retreat will take place at St Patrick's high school (56 New Ln, Eccles, Manchester M30 7JJ) on Saturday 11 February 2023. The retreat will start at 10am and ends with Holy Mass at 4pm. Children should bring with them a packed lunch and sufficient drinks for the day. There are limited places available, and places will be offered on a first come first served basis. **St Luke's Church Heating**: At its meeting on Thursday, the Diocesan Trustees' Property Committee gave its approval for us to go ahead with the installation of a new heating system for the church. This will be a new Air Handling Unit, similar in design and function to the system it is replacing, in terms of being gas-fired and blowing warm air into the church through the existing vent. The consultant heating engineer is still negotiating with a manufacturer of these units to get the most competitive price but, as noted in December, this is likely to cost around £100,000. We have roughly half of that amount in our deposit account and so will need to borrow the rest from the Diocese. We will need to try our best to raise some additional funds and repay that loan over the next few years.
