Reflections for This Week

I am the resurrection and the life

The Gospel of the Fifth Sunday is perhaps the deepest meditation on the mystery of Baptism and membership of the Church. It is a prelude to the events of Easter Sunday, when we celebrate the triumph of life over death. To be plunged into the waters of baptism is to be buried with Christ, only to rise with him from the waters. This paradox of life and death is the content of today's readings. There is no more important part of our faith than the resurrection: that Christ rose from the dead is the very centre and heart of all that we believe without it, our faith is useless. In the same way, our belief in our own resurrection is vital: it is the most deeply needed gift that Christ gives us. This is why the climax of the instructions given to candidates for Baptism was this teaching: that Christ would give them life after death. Look ahead to the 3rd Sunday of Easter, where Saint Peter preaches to the crowds – what he teaches them is that life comes after death, as it did for Lazarus, and for Christ himself.

Marriage Matters: The Lord will lead us back together: Ezekiel's words apply to us when we are going through tough times in our relationship, when intimacy, physical or otherwise, seems impossible. At such times, Jesus weeps for us as He did for Lazarus. He will bring us back together if we ask Him and are willing to be vulnerable enough to explore together the changes we need to make.

Think Vocation: Martha and Mary have strong faith in the Resurrection and Jesus builds on their faith at a very difficult time for them, by raising their recently deceased brother Lazarus from the dead. Let us pray for all those who are involved in working with the bereaved within the Church. May their faith in the resurrection bringing comfort and hope to those who feel the pain of the separation that death causes.

Resumption of Communion Under Both Kinds

The Bishop's Conference of England and Wales has agreed to remove the final restriction brought in by the pandemic and allow Bishops to reintroduce communion under both kinds in their Dioceses. Bishop John has therefore decided that, beginning at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, communion may once more be offered to the faithful from the chalice in our Diocese. But he is not insisting that this be the practice immediately, where priests may feel reluctant. He also recognises that there may be a degree of reluctance on the part of the faithful to avail themselves of this. Consequently, he is leaving it up to the priests in each parish to decide when it is prudent to resume this practice.

Fr Michael and Fr Mark have discussed this and both agree that we should not rush into it. Although the practice was well established at Ss Peter and Paul, we had only just introduced it at St Luke when the pandemic struck. Before introducing it then, we put articles on the newsletter or spoke about it from the altar for several weeks. Bishop John has asked that some similar catechesis be undertaken before reintroducing this in order to help us reflect on the centrality of the Eucharist in our lives, and to prepare us to receive the Precious Blood from the Chalice once again in our Diocese. We propose to offer that catechesis in the weeks after Easter and then, if there is a desire amongst you the parishioners for it, to reintroduce Communion under both kinds from the Feast of Corpus Christi (the Body and Blood of Christ) on the weekend of 10/11 June.
