Reflections for This Week

His face shone like the sun

Lent is a Season of preparation for the whole Paschal Triduum – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday: not just a time to reflect on the Cross. Often our Lenten devotions can focus exclusively on the Cross, and the idea of Baptism can be lost. This is why the Church invites us to join the disciples in looking beyond the cross this Sunday: we see the glory of Easter, the glory of the resurrection and the glory of the baptised. We see all this in the Transfiguration: we are invited to recognise who Jesus is. It is the glorified Jesus, whom we will celebrate at Easter, who calls us to journey through Lent, just as God called Abram to journey far from his home. So the readings lead us to acknowledge that Lent is a very special 'calling', to follow the Lord of glory to the renewal of baptismal purity.

Marriage Matters: Transformed by our love: Sometimes life is hard and we can get lost in the daily grind of making ends meet, of getting things done. Then, suddenly, a change occurs through a simple show of affection: a kiss, a touch, a loving glance from my beloved! In little gestures like these, we reveal again our love for each other and our relationship is transformed!

Think Vocation: God the Father instructs us to listen to His Son. In our Lenten discipline, may we remember those who are discerning whether the Lord is calling them to serve in the Church through the priesthood or consecrated life. By our prayers and encouragement may they be helped to listen to the voice of the Lord rather than to other conflicting voices calling them elsewhere.
