Reflections for This Week

He summoned his twelve disciples, and sent them out

The people of Israel were chosen by God, to be his own people. This Moses proclaims in the first reading. And having chosen a people, God does not abandon them: they may be like sheep without a shepherd, but God sends them the Good Shepherd, who feels sorry for them, and entrusts his disciples with the task of giving them new heart. The same God has chosen us, and gives us the same Shepherd. But we must be careful to take to ourselves the call of Jesus: we must pray for labourers to give new heart to the lost sheep of our society. We must also remember our own responsibility - as a kingdom of priests and a consecrated nation those of us in the Church have a mission to fulfil: to live out the Covenant, and truly to be a consecrated nation.

Marriage Matters: *Think of all the blessings:* Priests offer sacrifice and are 'mediators' between God and humans. Jesus was a Priest and a 'mediator', sacrificing Himself on the Cross and pleading, "*Father forgive them*". Baptism made us 'sharers' in Christ's Priesthood. At Mass, as a Priestly people, we join in His sacrifice and pray for ourselves and others. So, '*serve the Lord with gladness*', counting our blessings.

Think Vocation: Jesus feels sorry for the crowds because they were like sheep without a shepherd. Throughout the life of the Church, God has provided shepherds to look after and guide his people. Pray for more people to respond to God's call to be those shepherds in the present time and for the future of our Church.

Communion Under Both Kinds - Catechetical Reflection One

We follow on from last week's Feast of Corpus Christi with the start of the promised catechesis about Communion under both kinds. We first reflected on this back in January 2020, when we were preparing to introduce it at St Luke's, before Covid put a stop to our plans. On that occasion, we started with this quotation from Bishop John's Pastoral Letter in October 2019 in which, whilst introducing Stage 3 of Hope in the Future, he was encouraging all churches in the diocese to establish the practice of Communion under both kinds at Sunday and weekday Masses. He wrote:

"While it is true that receiving Holy Communion under one kind alone is to receive Our Lord whole and entire, it is also true that the Lord invited us to 'take and drink' as well as to 'take and eat'. It is right, where possible, to respond to this invitation of Our Lord. In this way, and in many others we will examine in this coming year, we can deepen our reverence towards, and understanding of, the real presence of the Lord who gives himself to us, and continue to grow in appreciation of the Mass as a personal encounter with our loving Saviour."
