Reflections for This Week
<p><i>Anyone who does not take his cross is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me.</i></p> <p>The Gospel and First Reading this Sunday can be summed up in one word: "hospitality". But not hospitality in general - this is a very specific hospitality: welcoming the word of God. We must welcome the message of salvation into our homes and hearts, and show this by welcoming the messenger who brings us this good news. Perhaps when we consider the messages we allow into our homes nowadays this theme reveals its relevance to us: television, radio and newspapers are all welcome in our homes. Surely the Gospel tells us to keep our eyes peeled for the holy man who brings real news. This Gospel also tells us about our mission: if we are welcomed or rejected, we should neither be proud nor worry for ourselves, but for Christ, because it is Christ who is welcomed or rejected.</p> <p><b>Marriage Matters:</b> Love grows when you give it away: We have become more aware over the years that the more we love, the more it grows. Our natural instinct is to always put ourselves first. 'To love' stands this mentality on its head! The Gospel says: "Anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it." When we experience being loved, we are enabled to love too!</p> <p><b>Think Vocation:</b> That all those discerning their vocations may not be afraid to change their lives for Christ as priests, deacons and in consecrated life.</p>

### Parish Finance Committee

This week we held the first meeting of the newly formed Parish Finance Committee, which exists "to assist, support and advise the parish priest in the sound administration of the temporal goods of the parish" (Constitution). Its remit covers finance, property, health & safety and human resources.

The initial membership of the committee is: Canon Michael Cooke, Graham Jackson, Peter Loughheed, David McGrath, Fr Mark Paver, David Raymond and Amanda Rice. We will meet quarterly and update the parish on relevant matters after each meeting.

### Communion Under Both Kinds - Catechetical Reflection Three

The Introduction to the Roman Missal states the reason for offering Holy Communion under both kinds, namely that "...even by means of the signs Communion will stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated" (GIRM 85) and "in this form (under both kinds) the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clear expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord." (GIRM 281)

It should also be emphasised that receiving the Precious Blood, while desirable, is not necessary: "...the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and consequently that as far as the effects are concerned, those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any of the grace that is necessary for salvation." (GIRM 282)
