### **Reflections for This Week**

"No man is an island..." How true this is for those who follow Christ: each of us has responsibilities towards each other, based on our 'debt of mutual love'. When we see wickedness and wrongdoing, then because of our privileged position of following the Lord Jesus, we have a duty to speak out. This will not always be easy - remember the prophet Jeremiah last week - but this was the mission of the Lord Jesus himself, and as his followers, it is our mission too. As with everything, love is 'the answer to every one of the commandments.'.

**Marriage Matters:** To listen is to Love: Matthew reminds us of Jesus' promise "...where two or more meet in my name I will be with them". In all the practical ways we look after each other, we are saying; 'your concerns are my concerns'. Nothing is too small or insignificant in our marriage, and my beloved is beside me to call me back to our life together.

#### Communion Under Both Kinds – Catechetical Reflection Seven

Due to the impact of Covid, there are some ongoing concerns/fears about receiving from the chalice. In agreeing that Communion under both kinds could be reintroduced, the Bishops Conference of England and Wales offered this advice: "Medical advice reassures us that the danger of infection is minimal when the chalice is made of precious metal, wine with a high alcohol content is used, and normal but effective purification of the vessel is performed between each communicant. As an extra precautionary measure, anyone suffering from Covid-19 or any similar illness (even flu and colds) should be advised to refrain from receiving from the chalice and may legitimately not attend Church on Sundays and Holydays."

Regarding the possibility of intinction, the bishops have decided to affirm the teaching in Celebrating the Mass (2005, #211) which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." Communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. This is taught clearly in the General Instruction on the Roman Missal (GIRM 287).

If we are to reintroduce Communion under both kinds (or indeed introduce it at St Luke's), there are some practical issues we will need to address. Most importantly, we will need to ensure we have enough Eucharistic Ministers who are happy to help with the chalice. We will also have to think about how to organise Communion in each church (currently flowing nicely with Communion under one kind)'
